


SENSATIONAL COLLAPSE OF BRIAN PEAD TRIAL

A trial against Brian Pead—his fifth criminal trial in under a year—sensationally collapsed on Monday 23rd January after the Judge forcefully rebuked the police officer for lying under oath and the CPS for allowing false documents against Brian to be entered into Court.

The Metropolitan Police officer, John Brown, of Bexleyheath Police, was reported by the Judge to the Crown Prosecution Service. Judge Robinson stated on the public record that it was clear that PC Brown had fabricated the evidence against Brian, that his version of events was easily disputed and found to be false, and that Brian’s evidence and version of events was clearly the one that was true.

Furthermore, the Crown Prosecution Service was itself rebuked for entering false documents into Court and for the vast waste of public

money in bringing this case in the first instance. A Crown Court trial costs in the region of £20,000 per day (excluding all the build-up costs at the Magistrates’ Court and pre-trial hearings), and thus this trial alone has cost the public purse something in the region of £100,000 in total as the police continue to harass an innocent man.

Brian—found guilty of a false allegation of Incitement in December 2009 in a trial which made a mockery of British Justice on a number of counts (not least because there was never even a victim) - was alleged to be in breach of a Court order, but he was found Not Guilty by the Judge, who was forced to dismiss the Jury because of the lies told by PC Brown and the false documents entered into Court which had been made to look genuine.

Litigant in Person

Two different firms of solicitors (both of whom had failed to provide Brian with disclosure of documents) tried to force Brian to enter a ‘Guilty’ plea. However, Brian refused and was thus forced to represent himself in the Crown Court.

He was given less than 24 hours to prepare his case, which is a travesty of justice in itself.

Brian had been given no Disclosure by the Crown Prosecution Service until the morning of the trial, so he was, in effect, “working blind”.

However, Brian knew that the case against him had been brought maliciously and he knew that he was not guilty, so he worked throughout the night to prepare his case, consulting his ever-growing library of law books.

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False testimony whilst under oath

Judge Robinson was forced on four separate occasions to remind PC Brown, of Bexleyheath Police, that he was under oath as his testimony was exposed as being false and without merit.

On one occasion he stated that Brian had not been at Bexleyheath Police Station on 4 January 2010, but when Brian produced a witness statement from Geoffrey Bacon—who has been cleared by the Home Office to work as a builder in Government and Royal buildings and is a man of honesty and integrity—PC Brown then claimed that he remembered that meeting “vividly”.

PC Brown was also exposed as having made false allegations in his witness statements and also rebuked by the

Judge for entering documents into Court which “...could not possibly be real...”

Judge Robinson stated on the public record that “Mr Pead’s version of events has the ring of truth and he has been able to substantiate his claims with genuine documents...”

“I am forced to dismiss the Jury because of PC Brown’s completely unreliable testimony...”

The Jury—who had only just returned to Court 10 after the break for lunch—were then thanked and sent home. Once the Jury had left the Court, Judge Robinson rebuked the Crown Prosecutor for bringing such an unreliable witness into Court and for entering false documents into Court.

PC Brown Reported to his Superiors

PC Brown, an officer with 34 years of experience, failed to live up to the high standards the public expects of its police officers.

His testimony was inept, unreliable, confused and “lacking in truth” according to Judge Robinson.

The Judge was forced to suggest to the CPS that it withdraw its case against Brian Pead based on the weak testimony of PC

Brown and false documentation.

PC Brown was asked by the Judge: “Where are your notebooks?”

PC Brown replied: “I haven’t brought any to Court with me.”

Judge Robinson: “Then how can you substantiate anything you’re telling the Jury?”

PC Brown: “I can’t.”



Do not run away with the idea that you can't possibly be on it just because you've never spoken to the police or been to court.

Every year thousands of people are added to it without their knowledge.


'Local intelligence' is added all the time: how do you know that that neighbour you had an argument with didn't report you to the Police as a sex offender?

The fact is you don't know—unless you ask. You have the right under the Freedom of Information Act and the Data

Protection Act to get a print-out of ALL the data held on you by the Police.

Most Police forces have a ready-printed form on their website for you to download and complete and seek a true copy of your record on the Police National Database.

All Around Justice would urge that you don't wait to find out one day if there is information stored about you—fill in the appropriate forms and demand to see your record NOW!

Belmarsh Prison

Belmarsh maximum security prison houses a good number of suspected terrorists. It also houses rapists, murderers and sex offenders (who are placed on their own separate wing for their protection).

Brian was moved from cell to cell every two or three days in order to disrupt him. Prisoners laughed at the Police when he told them his 'crime'!

As a Law student at Greenwich University, and a fully qualified counsellor, Brian was often in demand to help prisoners with their own stories of hardship, miscarriages of justice and abuses of process.

Brian was also sent to Wandsworth Prison—the largest male prison in the country with more than 1,600 inmates.

Brian Pead spent 7 weeks in prison. His crime? Saying 'Hello' to his own 12 year old grand-daughter, Emily, as she got off the bus. We kid you not!

The Police claimed that she was a witness in a case (she wasn't, nor has ever been and that's easily provable, of course) and that Brian had "intimidated a witness" by saying "Hello" to Emily.

Coming soon



Members of All Around Justice were present at the high profile trial of Tottenham Manager, Harry Redknapp, and Sheffield Wednesday Chairman, Milan Mandaric.

This case had a number of connections with Brian Pead's original trial, which was also at Southwark Crown Court.

All Around Justice was formed on 23 December 2009, the very same day that Harry Redknapp and Milan Mandaric were Indicted on allegations of defrauding Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs.

However, there the similarities ended. Multi-millionaire Redknapp and billionaire Milan Mandaric were financially able to instruct highly qualified defence counsel.

Brian, on the other hand, had been sacked from his job as a counsellor with Off Centre in Hackney just two days after his arrest and he had not even been charged!

The Police were also instrumental in attempting to "run Brian out of money" by forcing his tenants—who were renting out his house prior to the trial in December 2009—to leave Brian's house and stop paying the rent.

On the very same day that his tenants were forced to leave his

house (though the Police have no legal jurisdiction in a civil matter), four officers from Bexleyheath beat him up in the street near his house while he was waiting at a bus-stop.

Then the Police went to the house of two witnesses to the brutal beating and forced them to withdraw their complaint about police brutality.

Farcical trial

For legal reasons we are unable to go into detail at present about the abuses of process that occurred at Brian's farcical trial that did not occur in the high profile trial of Harry Redknapp and Milan Mandaric. However, a full commentary will soon be available on the forthcoming website.
